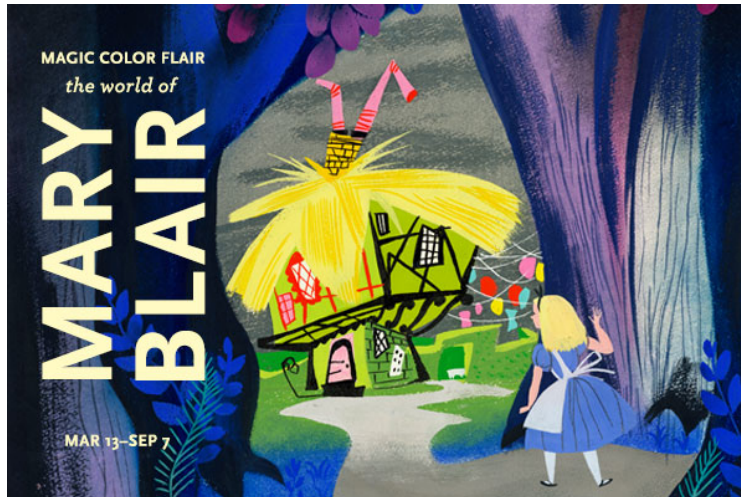

ABOUT THE EXHIBITION

MAGIC, COLOR, FLAIR: the world of Mary Blair is a comprehensive exhibition that explores the artistic process and development of one of Walt’s most original, beloved, and influential designers and art directors, Mary Blair (1911–1978). Blair’s joyful creativity, appealing designs, and exuberant color palette endure in numerous media, including classic Disney animated films such as *Cinderella*, *Alice in Wonderland*, and *Peter Pan*, as well as theme park attractions at Disneyland and Walt Disney World, most notably *it’s a small world*.

Thirty-five years after her death, interest in Mary Blair and her enchanting artworks continues

to grow. Her early fine art watercolors and classic Disney film production concept paintings are popular with collectors. Contemporary artists still find inspiration in Blair's independent spirit, her ability to survive in traditionally male-dominated fields, her technical virtuosity, bottomless creative ingenuity, and powerful visual storytelling.

ABOUT THE MUSEUM

The Walt Disney Family Museum presents the fascinating story and achievements of Walt Disney, the man who raised animation to an art, transformed the film industry, tirelessly pursued innovation, and created a global and distinctively American legacy. Opened in October 2009, the 40,000 square foot facility features the newest technology and historic materials and artifacts to bring Disney's achievements to life, with interactive galleries that include early drawings and animation, movies, music, listening stations, a spectacular model of Disneyland and much more.

Hours: 10am to 6pm, Wednesdays through Monday; closed on Tuesdays and the following public holidays: New Year's Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.
